REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING NOVEMBER 6, 2023

The regular meeting of the Spring Valley City Council was held in the City Hall Council Chambers, 215 N. Greenwood Street, Spring Valley, Il. 61362 and called to order by Mayor Malooley Thompson at 7:00 p.m. with the following Aldermen answering present to the roll call: Mike Herrmann, CJ VanSchaick, Chris Affelt, Jeff Chiaventone, Deb Baltikauski, Ken Bogacz and Dave Pellegrini. Absent: Greg Campbell. 7 present. 1 absent.

All joined in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

There were no public comments on agenda items.

#14766 Moved by Alderman Baltikauski and seconded by Herrmann that we dispense with the reading of the minutes of the last regular meeting. Aye votes: Herrmann, VanSchaick, Affelt, Chiaventone, Baltikauski, Bogacz and Pellegrini. 7 ayes. Motion carried.

Alderman Pellegrini reported the large replacement tree at the mini park should be installed on Wednesday or Thursday.

Chief Curran reported they have started the Police officer testing process and will be having interviews Wednesday and hopes to hire new officers to replace those that we have lost, the new squad car he ordered in January is coming in soon, we were awarded a \$125,000 Cops Grant which will be used for a school resource officer position noting the High School is on board to help supplement the cost, he has applied for a body camera grant and hopes to hear back in the next week or two, and the Holiday season has started with the PBIS program at JFK and asked that anyone who may know a family in need for the holiday to please let him know.

Mike Richetta from Chamlin and Associates reported that he checked into an Industrial discharge permit for the Gillan project and they do not need one for that business. Richetta did note we will need to update our city code to include rates and limits for sewer disposal and limits on phosphorus and ammonia.

Superintendent Norton reported leaf pickup has started and will continue as long as he can.

Mayor Malooley Thompson reported that the new roof is on the Community Building, Pinter Construction is scheduling Koolmaster Co. to install the new windows and will be working on the front façade and Alderman Affelt is working with James Hardie to see if we can get a discount on or a donation of the siding for the façade.

A Water and Sewer Committee meeting was scheduled for Monday, October 23, 2023 at 6:30 p.m. to discuss Gillan's plan and sanitary sewer location as well as any other matters that may come before the committee.

Alderman Bogacz discussed the upcoming Street Program and asked the council if we wanted a 1-year or a 2-year program. There was council discussion and Mike Richetta from Chamlin and Associates will work on an estimate for the next 12 worst streets and figure funds available for the project.

Fire Chief Bogatitus was present to discuss a referendum for a Fire Protection District. He would like to have the question on the April Ballot and explained increases in cost to run the Fire Department and feels it would be in the best interest to allow the department to try to pass a fire district. City Attorney Steele noted he has spoken with Attorney Sinclair who has knowledge in forming a Fire District and he feels it is too late to get on the April ballot. There was discussion regarding the proposed fire district. Attorney Steele will speak with Mr. Sinclair and arrange for a meeting with him and Chief Bogatitus to discuss further.

Chief Curran reminded the council the Lighted Parade and tree lighting is this weekend.

Superintendent Norton reported the leaf machine is functional but they are behind schedule and will continue to do their best as long as the weather permits.

There were no petitions received for consideration.

The following bids (2) for Building Demolition (228 E. St. Paul Street) were received by November 13, 2023 at 10:00 a.m. opened and read out loud:

Mike Richetta from Chamlin reported M & O Environmental will be contracting River City Demolition as the demolition contractor and he recommends approving the low bid from M & O Environmental with the subcontractor agreement.

Chief Curran reported we were pre-approved for a body camera grant in the amount of \$60,000. The cameras will be mandatory effective January 1, 2024.
