## REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING AUGUST 5, 2024

The regular meeting of the Spring Valley City Council was held in the City Hall Council Chambers, 215 N. Greenwood Street, Spring Valley, II. 61362 and called to order at 7:00 p.m. with the following Aldermen answering present to the roll call: Mike Herrmann, C.J. VanSchaick, Chris Affelt, Jeff Chiaventone, Greg Campbell, Deb Baltikauski, Ken Bogacz and Dave Pellegrini. 8 present.

All joined in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

The following report was received and placed on file:

Mayor Malooley Thompson reminded the council that tomorrow is National Night Out and encouraged everyone to stop by noting the Police Department has been working very hard on the event. Mayor Malooley Thompson also reported she met with Superintendent Norton and Mike Richetta about improving and making a long-term plan for Coal Miners Park.

Alderman Bogacz discussed the agenda item for the sidewalk program noting he handed out the second half of the program tonight. He noted we can use Safe Routes to Schools grant around the high school. Mike Richetta spoke with IDOT and while they can't relocate the previous requested location to Heather Apartments we can reapply with a new location and we won't lose the funds we already have.

Chief Curran reported the crime rate in Spring Valley is down 30% and commends his police officers for that. He also noted Officer Rios, Officer Pellegrini and Dispatcher Moreno have been putting in a lot of work for National Night Out.

Chief Curran then introduced new Police Officers Robert Pohar and Michael Oslanzi to the Mayor and Council.

Mike Richetta from Chamlin and Associates noted the Caroline Street Watermain Improvements are on the agenda for approval tonight and bids for the city hall roof are scheduled for a bid opening on August 19, 2024.

Superintendent Norton reported the Rt 89 tower painting is underway.

Mayor Malooley-Thompson noted there will be a ribbon cutting at Club 100 on September 4<sup>th</sup> and asked that any council members who are available to please attend, she commended Grow SV on a well-attended last Farmers Market and reported that the windows have been installed at the Community Center and we are waiting on Pinter to put on the siding.

Alderman Pellegrini reported the pool is closed as the lifeguards are now back to college and high school also noting the pool had a good year and attendance, we will be starting to paint the pickle ball court and Gillan is donating a sidewalk to the court.

Chief Curran reported the School Resource Officer started last week, everything is positive and the school is happy to have him, we have received the grant funds for the Body Cameras, and National Night Out was a success with more in attendance than last year and he thanked all involved with the event. Chief Curran introduced Phil Nanni from Flock who presented information in regard to software and cameras at several intersections.

Mike Richetta reported the roof bids are on the agenda, handed out an updated project for the proposed OSLAD grant application and then noted the 2024 Street Program has been submitted to IDOT for approval.

Superintendent Norton reported he will be speaking with Hall Township on what has been done in the past to close up Barto Landing.

Mike Richetta from Chamlin and Associates distributed and discussed the Engineer's Estimate of Cost for the OSLAD Grant 2024 Park Development Costs. It was noted that the maximum grant amount is \$600,000. with a \$600,000 match. The proposed grant project has been reduced to be within the grant amount some of which includes a smaller concession building, no artificial turf or lighting. It was noted that the city has no intermediate field in town and our players are going to other towns to play games. It was also explained that the city must do the development that is applied for but we can apply for future OSLAD Grants to expand on the development. The city is asking for community support for this project so our children have a place at home to play ball and won't always have to go to other towns.

Mike Richetta also discussed the ITEP Grant and is updating the cost estimate removing the parking lot and band shelter which is not allowed in the grant.
